Lisbon was founded in 1825 and the President was John Quincey Adams. Not a whole lot was happening at the time, besides the first College Fraternity and the Creek Indian tribe giving up the last of their lands to the U.S government and moved west.

We have an older man who walks around the festival dressed like John Chapman and hands out apples to the children. There are rides, and so many people, and competitions, and singing and dancing. It's beautiful.



I also love the Columbiana County Fair. This fair doesn't have the same cool story as the Johnny Appleseed, but it's cool too. It has horse shows, barrel racing competitions, drag races, tractor races, animal showings, and rides. We go the whole redneck nine yards. But it's all good fun.

Historic Attractions include the Old Stone House Museum, and the Railroad Museum. In these cute little museums, you can learn more about my villages history. And apparently, according to the Old Stone Museum, We invented the straw.
