Brief History of Walnut Creek, Ohio


In 1809 Walnut Creek had its first permanent settler, Jonas Stutzman. Jonas traveled to Walnut Creek from Somerset County, Pa. to clear land for farming, and to build a house for his family. Jonas and his wife were of the Amish faith. The Amish are decedents from a group of strict Protestant Anabaptist. Jonas and other Amish pioneer settlers founded Walnut Creek in 1825, and it is now one of the largest Amish settlements in North America.

Who was the President when this town was founded? And, what was the political environment in America at that time.

John Quincy Adams, the 6th president of the United States, was president when Walnut Creek was founded.



The Erie Canal, which runs through Ohio, was completed while Adams was in office, linking the Great Lakes to the East Coast and enabling a flow of products such as grain, and farm produce to Eastern markets. Adams also sought to provide Native Americans with territory in the West.

Oldest business/largest businesses today.

The Der Dutchman has been in Walnut Creek over 30 years. Located in the center of town, it is the best restaurant destination for tourists and townsfolk. Their Amish Kitchen Cooking is the No. 1 reason generations of visitors have made the trip to Der Dutchman every year. But their hilltop location and spectacular view come in a close second.




City government.

“The township is governed by a three-member board of trustees, who are elected in November of odd-numbered years to a four-year term beginning on the following January 1. Two are elected in the year after the presidential election and one is elected in the year before it. There is also an elected township fiscal officer, who serves a four-year term beginning on April 1 of the year after the election, which is held in November of the year before the presidential election.” (Wikipedia)
